### 80 Years of People Helping People

Eighty years ago a group of travelling salesmen, who were based in Sudbury, decided to form a Sudbury Council of the Associated Canadian Travellers. known now as A.C.T./UCT. original charter members were wellknown businessmen in Sudbury and included S.A. Woodruff as President, O.H. Bingham as Secretary and members S. Rothschild. C.H. Littleiohn. G.A. Godwin and G. Frood. On August 13, 1943, the Sudbury Council #1051 was officially incorporated and became the 21st of more than 60 councils that once existed in Canada.

The idea for the A.C.T. started one winter evening in 1918 when three travelling salesmen were waiting for a train to take them home to Calgary after a busy week on the road. They began talking and the conversation drifted to the helpful work being done by service clubs in their area. They wondered if it would be possible to organize a commercial travelers club that would not only help its members, but help the communities in which they lived and worked. They held their first meeting that very night with six initial members, by the following week their numbers had doubled and before long chapters began opening in different cities and provinces throughout Canada.

By 1924 a Dominion Council was formed, with the head office based in Calgary and elections were held to elect the executive from existing councils. Sudbury Council members H.F. Shaw held the position of Dominion President from 1953 to 1955 and Louis J. Narbone from 1973 to 1975. Since that time several Sudbury members have been elected and served on the Board of A.C.T./UCT nationally.

Originally, the purpose of the organization was to provide accident insurance for travelling salesmen who were mostly independent contractors. Protecting the rights of its members and aiding those dependent upon them. In those davs travelling salesmen had no insurance to protect themselves and their families in the event of an accident or death. Soon the members of councils across Canada began raising funds for people and groups in their communities who needed help. At its inception A.C.T./ UCT was described as a fraternal society open only to men who worked as commercial travelers however that has changed.

Eighty years means A.C.T./UCT has evolved. A lot of economic and environmental factors have changed.

Our membership is now made up of men and women from every walk of life. In Sudbury our focus of "People Helping People" continues and is unwavering. While many councils in Canada have struggled with declining membership, locally we have survived through these pressures and continued to assist our members and the community. From sponsoring construction of a room at the Alzheimer's Centre to the accessible play structure in Bell Park along with over fifty years continuous sponsorship for Sudbury Minor Baseball we are well established in our community. In our 80 years of service to our members and the Greater City of Sudbury community we have donated millions of dollars and continue to be "People Helping People" every day.

### Maison McCulloch Hospice

For someone on an end-of-life journey – whether it is their own or the journey of a loved one - the comfort and serenity of their environment is of paramount importance. The surrounding view has the power to calm, to inspire reflection and ultimately facilitate one's reconciliation with their circumstances.



The ACT/UCT membership understood this and – in 2009 – purchased a treed archway for the lakeside grounds. This archway provides a beautiful leafy

canopy to those who stand under it for shade – a vision of vibrant colours in the fall to it's onlookers. They also provided a beautiful table and chair set for the upper grounds – a great place to have a sit and appreciate the outdoors.

But the generosity of the ACT/UCT did not stop there. In 2018 - during the expansion of the existing 10-bed site - plans were made for a larger kitchen operation requiring commercial kitchen equipment. This group stepped up to the plate again in a big way and purchased a commercial freezer to support the increased food storage capacity we would require. Today, Maison McCulloch Hospice is the largest single-site hospice operation with 20-beds and 5 service programs available to our community!



## The Foyer Inner City Home de/of Sudbury (ICH)



The Foyer Inner City Home de/of Sudbury (ICH) is an emergency food bank with no funding and overseen by a volunteer board of directors, one full time Administrator and approximately 60 volunteers and with no government funding. ICH at 251 Elm Street operates Mon. to Fri. from 1 pm until 3:45 pm; 1169 Dollard St. in New Sudbury Tues. from 10 am until 1 pm.

The doors at the ICH opened in 1986 as a place to give hospitality when there was nowhere else to go. The food bank opened a short time later.

Community partners, local businesses, concerned individuals, service clubs and churches play a vital role in our operation. For every \$ donated we generate 3\$ of purchasing power at

National Grocers. Funds are generated with special events as well as participation in the 50/50 programs at Sudbury Wolves and Five games, Delta Bingos, stores, churches and schools often organize food drives. Volunteers like the Lockerby Legion play a significant role with the events. Free life-skills programming slowed down recently because of a lack of volunteer instructors. We are in the midst of starting up again.

When I speak of community partners, I must point out the help and support we receive on an ongoing basis from our local ACT/UCT organization. The partnership has provided a healthy awareness in the community. The membership provides programs and participates in raising funds that are donated back to the ICH. This partnership is what helps our organization remain solid and viable.

On behalf of our Board of Directors and the many families and children we serve, I congratulate the ACT/UCT celebrating 80 years of community service from 1943 to 2023. We are so proud to be a partner with such community minded citizens.






### **LUPUS Ontario**

Lupus Ontario and ACT/UCT



In 1978, Honey Agar and Linda Ethier were hospitalized in Toronto with a mysterious disease called lupus. They were extremely frustrated that there was little known about the disease and how to treat it. They immediately recognized the need for more education for both the public and for physicians on lupus and the need for money for lupus research. They were determined to raise funds for education and lupus research in the hope that other lupus patients would get better care and perhaps a cure could be found.

In 1985, Honey and Linda presented their case for funding to ACT/UCT. They were delighted when the organization agreed to provide funding to the Ontario Lupus Association (OLA) which is now known as Lupus Ontario. This was the beginning of a relationship which continues to this day.

ACT/UCT became Lupus Ontario's first sponsor and funded a two-day seminar on lupus epidemiology. Geoff Carr, then President of ACT/UCT was instrumental in establishing this partnership. In honour of Geoff Carr, the Annual Lupus Ontario Geoff Carr Fellowship was established to train rheumatologists to become experts in diagnosing and treating lupus. Each Fellow is also required to complete a research project. The first Fellow was trained in 1990 and to date 35 Fellows have been trained. The majority are still practicing in Canada, mostly in Ontario.

ACT/UCT continues to support the Lupus Ontario Geoff Carr Fellowship and the Annual WALK for Lupus Ontario. The proceeds from the WALK for Lupus Ontario go towards support and education programs for lupus patients and their families, and advocacy projects aimed at improving programs and services for lupus patients.

Lupus Ontario's mission is to provide vital support, education, awareness, advocacy, and research through the fundraising efforts of our staff and volunteer community to help those with lupus live longer, healthier and better lives. As the largest Canadian provincial organization focused on lupus, Lupus Ontario has spent the last 46 years focused on improving the lives of lupus patients and their families.

Lupus is a debilitating autoimmune disease where the body attacks itself causing inflammation, pain, and possible organ damage. Five million people suffer from lupus globally and there is currently no cure. Nine out of ten lupus patients are women, usually diagnosed between the ages of 15 and 45. Lupus is a condition that takes on average 6 years to diagnose as there are a multitude of possible symptoms/markers.

Lupus Ontario is very grateful that ACT/UCT recognized the need to support this incurable disease. Treatments have dramatically improved over the years, but we still have not found a cure. Thank you to ACT/UCT for continuing the journey to someday achieve Life Without Lupus. Everyone at Lupus Ontario sends best wishes to ACT/UCT on their 80th Anniversary.nd





Each year A.C.T./UCT sponsors at least one team and members visit the Terry Fox Complex to see their teams in action, often bringing with them hats and treats for the players.








# Forest Ridge Golf and Country Club




